




10 OFFICIALS JET OFF TO BEIJING FOR GLOBAL TRAINING

The seminar will explore China's development model, digital innovation, and leadership strategies to help our young change-makers drive national progress.





NSC'S SARA CAMARA AT THE YOUTH ENTREPRENEURSHIP SEMINAR IN CHINA

Beijing, China – July 9, 2025

Sara Camara, Communication and Public Relations Manager of The Gambia's National Sports Council (NSC), is among 30 young Gambian leaders currently in Beijing, China, participating in the "Seminar on Youth Entrepreneurship and Leadership for Gambia." The 14-day program, organized by the Academy for International Business Officials (AIBO) under the Chinese Ministry of Commerce (MOFCOM), kicked off today with an official opening ceremony.

Camara joins a diverse group of delegates selected by the Ministry of Youth and Sports to represent Gambia in this China-aided initiative, which aims to build entrepreneurial capacity, leadership skills, and foster greater cooperation between China and developing countries.

The opening ceremony featured remarks from Mr. Wu Wei, Director of the Executive Department for China-aid Training Programs at AIBO, and Mr. Mbye Saine, Project Coordinator of the Gambia Songhai Initiative/Youth Agribusiness Training Center.

In his address, Mr. Saine thanked MOFCOM and AIBO for their continued partnership with The Gambia and encouraged participants to embrace the knowledge shared, form meaningful partnerships, and return home as empowered agents of development.

Mr. Wu extended a warm welcome to the delegation, reaffirming China's commitment to supporting Gambia's growth through cooperation in agriculture, infrastructure, health, and youth empowerment—key focus areas under the Belt and Road Initiative and South-South Cooperation.

Day one of the seminar opened with a lecture by Ambassador Chen Mingming from China's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, titled "Overview of China's National Conditions." The session offered a deep dive into China's history, governance system, economic success, and global influence—providing participants with a comparative lens to reflect on Gambia's own development journey.

In the afternoon, attention shifted to digital innovation with a session on "Development and Operation of Cross-Border E-Commerce Platforms and Its Practice in The Gambia." The lecture emphasized the potential of digital trade and how young Gambians can leverage e-commerce for economic growth and regional competitiveness.





ROAD ACCIDENT INVOLVING GAMBIA'S U 16 TEAM IN GUINEA CONAKRY

The Gambia Basketball Association wishes to inform the general public, especially stakeholders that our national U 16 male and female teams that departed The Gambia by bus in the afternoon of Wednesday 16th July, 2025, to participate in the Afro FIBA Zone 2 Basketball competition in Guinea got involved in an accident in the town of Kindia Linsan, while approaching Conakry.

Information received so far indicates that some of the 30 players and officials sustained injuries and are currently receiving treatment at the Kindia Regional Hospital. However, all those injured are in stable condition and continued to be observed by medical personnel under the supervision of the FIBA Zone 2 executive and officials of the government of Guinea.

The GBA is cooperating with the Gambia government through the MOYS and Foreign Affairs to coordinate with the authorities in Guinea to ensure the team gets the best possible medical attention. The public will be updated accordingly.



PRIVATE JET TO EVACUATE U16 BASKETBALL TEAM

The Hon. Minister of Youth and Sports, Bakary Y. Badjie, has confirmed that President Adama Barrow has instructed the immediate deployment of a private jet to evacuate The Gambia's U16 basketball team, following their involvement in a road accident in Guinea.

Speaking from the airport, where he is overseeing preparations alongside his ministry officials and other stakeholders, Minister Badjie stated that the private jet has already departed and will make two inbound trips to ensure the safe return of both players and officials.

A medical team from the Ministry of Health and the Edward Francis Small Teaching Hospital (EFSTH) is currently on standby at the airport to conduct medical assessments upon the team's arrival. Those who require further treatment will be taken for specialized care, while others will be received by officials of the Gambia Basketball Association and escorted home.

The Ministry assures the public that all necessary steps are being taken to provide care and support for the team. Further updates will follow as the evacuation unfolds.



HONOURABLE MINISTER BAKARY Y. BADJIE HANDS OVER NATIONAL FLAG, ALLOCATES D7 MILLION TO TEAM GAMBIA FOR MAIDEN ANOCA SCHOOL GAMES IN ALGERIA

In a show of patriotism and strong government support for youth and sports development, the Honourable Minister of Youth and Sports, Bakary Y. Badjie, on Saturday officially handed over the Gambian national flag to the delegation set to represent the country at the inaugural ANOCA (Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa) School Games in Algeria.

Hon. Badjie was accompanied by the Acting Executive Director of the National Sports Council (NSC), Mr. Mahmoud L. Jawla, during the symbolic ceremony, further underscoring institutional backing for the country's participation.

The brief yet spirited event was held at the FIFA Gold Project in Yundum, where Minister Badjie reaffirmed The Gambia's commitment to nurturing young talents and supporting them on international platforms. In his remarks, the Minister revealed that the government, through his Ministry, allocated D7 million out of a proposed D9 million budget to fully fund the country's participation in the games.

"This is a historic moment for us, as it marks The Gambia's first appearance at the ANOCA School Games. We are proud of the team and have no doubt they will represent us with pride and discipline," Minister Badjie declared, as he presented the national flag to the delegation.

The Gambian contingent consists of athletes competing in six sporting disciplines: athletics, beach volleyball, swimming, judo, and 3x3 basketball.

The ANOCA School Games is a newly introduced continental sports initiative aimed at promoting sports development and unity among school-going youth across Africa. This year's edition, to be hosted in Algeria, brings together some of the continent's most promising young athletes.



GAMBIAN YOUTH LEADERS CONCLUDE CHINA-AID SEMINAR WITH RENEWED PURPOSE AND STRONGER TIES

The Seminar on Youth Entrepreneurship and Leadership for The Gambia, hosted in Beijing under the China-Aid initiative by AIBO (Academy for International Business Officials) of MOFCOM, concluded on July 21, 2025, with a closing ceremony, certificate presentation, and farewell luncheon.

The two-week program brought together 30 Gambian youth leaders, selected by the Ministry of Youth and Sports, for lectures, field visits, and cultural exchange to promote entrepreneurship, leadership, and bilateral cooperation.

Key highlights:

- Lectures on China's political system, cross-border e-commerce, and poverty alleviation.
- Visits to Great Wall, Temple of Heaven, Hongqiao Pearl Market, and Harbin's Digital Trade Industrial Park.
- Engagement with Longjian Road and Bridge Co. Ltd., builders of the iconic Gambia River Bridge.

Speeches:

- Mberry Jobe (Deputy Executive Director, GNYC) called the seminar "unforgettable and transformative," emphasizing strengthened Gambia-China ties.
- Wu Wei (AIBO) praised participants' enthusiasm, calling them "the future of The Gambia."

The program ended with certificate awards and a courtesy visit to the Gambian Embassy in Beijing. Participants returned home on July 22–23, pledging to use the experience to drive youth empowerment, national development, and Gambia–China cooperation.

This initiative forms part of China's Belt and Road Initiative and South-South Cooperation, promoting global development through knowledge exchange and capacity building.
